One day in 1974, a woman like you and I was at her vets in the Freshfields area. Lesley watched as a dog went into the treatment room, and only the owner came out. She asked the vet how the dog was, to be told that he had just been destroyed because he wasn't wanted anymore. Shocked and really upset, Lesley insisted the vet call her if this happened again.

There were many calls. Freshfields Animal Rescue had begun.

In the following weeks, months and years, Lesley was joined by kind people from all walks of life - all united by a passion to undo the harm caused to animals at the hands of people.
